

Frigorífico de Las Tunas consolidates its services

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Las Tunas.- The provision of services to around twenty clients and better availability of work infrastructure allow the base business unit (UEB) Enfrigo 1100 Las Tunas to consolidate its economic indicators, despite the complex electro-energy scenario that the region is experiencing. country.

Heberto Eduardo Leyva Domínguez, director of the entity popularly known as Frigorífico, told the Cuban News Agency exclusively that the UEB receives energy protection in terms of the allocation of megawatts and the availability of two generating sets with the fuel they need. .

However, the current situation has made us design a series of savings and work organization actions aimed at reducing electricity expenditure during peak hours and thus cooperate with the stabilization of the electrical service, he said.

Leyva Domínguez explained that they currently have six refrigeration chambers and two freezing chambers that allow them to sustain services in stages, while they work to inject the ammonia that a third freezing chamber needs.

The goal is to close the month of November with a dozen of these air-conditioned infrastructures in order to achieve a greater capacity of services to the 22 clients, including state and new economic actors, who today preserve their products in the Las Tunas Refrigerator, the manager stressed. .

In addition to the benefits as a socialist state company to the state sector, the growing insertion of new forms of management among our clients has allowed us to increase our services qualitatively and quantitatively - he added -; and although the country has 33 meat processing plants and some are paralyzed, Las Tunas aspires to be among the top 10.

Although it belongs to a national company, such results mean that Enfrigo 1100 Las Tunas is proposed to become a subsidiary company based on the income and quality it currently exhibits in its services, which also translates into improvements for the economic remuneration of the workers and the working conditions they now have.
